

Comprehension

To understand the words read and make sense of the information. Comprehension Strategies are designed to guide your child to read with a purpose, make connections with the text being read, and engage in a deep understanding of text.

Strategies for Comprehension Success

- Model how to make connections with text, by connecting with other texts you and your child have read, and/or connections with him/herself, and/or connections with others. These skills will take modeling, questions and think aloud to show your child good strategies to understanding what is read. This is a three step process
 - 1. Model/ Instruction/Guide
 - 2. Practice
 - 3. Transfer the use of strategy to other texts.
- 10 Questions Good Readers Ask as They Read
- Visualize what you read
- Create a journal; include steps and questions good readers ask as they read. Have student create an entry before, during and/or after reading.
- SCS' Power Tools are strategies that students can use to assist them in the process of comprehension in all types of reading.

 - 1. Sketch to Stretch
 - 2. <u>ViP</u>
 - 3. <u>SQ3R</u>
 - 4. Mind Maps
 - 5. Graphic Organizers
