Students will take a rambling journey through California's visual history, a history shaped by a unique mixture of Mexican and Anglo traditions as well as the state's position on the Pacific Rim. Each painting epitomizes California's land, people and offerings as a place of produce and plenty. The exhibition brings together many of the museum's most cherished paintings, including works by early artists documenting the Mission and Rancho periods; landscapes by plain air painters portraying California's coasts and canyons; sumptuous portraits and still-life paintings of flowers and paper-wrapped fruit by Alberta and William McCloskey; and a small selection of works indicating California as a continued place of possibility. This will be the first public display of many of the selected paintings, some of which have spent years in storage. This program also includes an art project of Landscape Painting.
