


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



Hemet Quest Students were invited to a waffle breakfast where they enjoyed a yummy breakfast and an opportunity to purchase their uniforms without the long lines!

Hemet Firemen gave the students a lesson on how to put on the protective gear, and Hemet PD explained the various devices and tools on the squad car to middle school students


Our military guests challenged students to do push-ups with their gear on.

A local Marine got up close to answer questions from a curious kindergarten student.








Back-to-School Night & Orientation


Magnolia is busting at the seams waiting for our new building to be ready. Our high school and middle school students are currently attending classes at the church next door to the Pathfinder Student Center.

Trenton Visyak has earned his Eagle rank and celebrated his accomplishment at his Eagle Court of Honor on August 5, 2017. Trenton joined the Boy Scout program when he was in first grade as a Tiger Scout. He is currently active in Grand Terrace Troop 40, Rialto Venture Crew 1110, A-TSA Chapter Order of the Arrow, and Order of the Arrow Ceremony team. Along with his journey, he was the A-TSA Chapter Chief for 2016 and earned his Brotherhood in 2015.

Over his 12 years of scouting, some of the adventures he participated in are camping, hiking, rappelling down rocks and waterfalls, canoeing, welding, and shotgun shooting. To become part of the 4% of boys that become Eagle Scouts, Trenton completed requirements that involved leadership, outdoor skills, and service.

For his Eagle project, Trenton worked with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, Search & Rescue Division, on a GPS location project to be used for evacuation during fires or other natural disasters. He worked with Search & Rescue personnel, civic leaders, and volunteers to ensure this project was a success. Trenton, along with 16 volunteers, worked over 400 community service hours to complete this project.
