



### **Springs Charter Schools' Re-enrollment Process**

As our charters indicate, students must make adequate and appropriate progress in meeting academic standards. Students must complete all weekly core assignments or otherwise speak to their teachers or Education Specialist to develop a plan for completion of all assigned work. Parents/guardians of students who fail to complete weekly core assignments as expected, will be contacted by the teacher and school administration and notified that the student is not making adequate progress and to offer to meet with the parent and student to address the situation and develop a plan to support the student.

Parents/guardians of students who are not making adequate progress will be notified of the school's intention to disenroll the student and provided with the opportunity to meet with teachers and school administrators to discuss options to remedy the situation. If parent/guardian fails to respond or is unable to meet the conditions for continued enrollment they will be notified of the school intention to disenroll their student. Parents/guardians may appeal the school's action within five school days of receipt of the Notice to Disenroll letter.

Springs students who are disenrolled due to inadequate progress are not eligible to re-enroll for the remainder of the current school year and may not be eligible to enroll for one full academic year in which the student has demonstrated academic success an another accredited school.
