

What is History Day:

National History Day is an academic competition focusing on history students in grades 6-12 (though 4th and 5th graders may participate in the elementary division). It is a lot like a Science Fair for History.

It is a non-profit education organization based in College Park, Maryland and the NHD contest encourages more than half a million students around the world to conduct historical research on a topic of their choice that relates to the theme of that particular year.

What do Students do:

Students will look through libraries, archives and museums, conduct oral history interviews, and visit historic sites researching a topic related to the National History Day theme. After they have analyzed and interpreted sources, and have drawn a conclusion about the significance of their topic, they will then be able to present their work in one of five ways: <u>as a paper, an exhibit, a performance</u>, a documentary, or a website. The Elementary Division (4th-5th Grade) may only participate in a poster that is 30"x40" in size and does not exceed 350 words. It may either be done individually, or as a group project.

2019 Theme:

Every year National History Day frames students' research within a historical theme. The theme is chosen for the broad application to world, national, or state history and its relevance to ancient history or to the more recent past. The 2018-2019 theme is *Triumph & Tragedy in History*. The theme book below is full of information on how to use that theme as well as project ideas.
