

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


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
Mrs. Padilla's Kindergarten class apple tasting.



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
Our first day of Lego STEM rose to the engineering occasion, with Skyscrapers! The students engineering endeavor of the school year.

















High School Block Party and Orientation were held during our


Homeschool SPREE events are right around the corner!

Jaydan Driskill, 17, class of 2019, chose Venture Online because it allows her to have more flexibility in her training schedule and to take control of her education. Jaydan wrestles in the 57 kilos class and is in the Olympic development program. She began wrestling competitively in her freshman year of high school, specializing in Freestyle wrestling. Jaydan's goal is to participate as a Freestyle wrestler in the 2024 Olympics.

A typical day for Jaydan starts with working out in the weight room at 5:30 a.m., then school work and finishing with a three-hour practice. Going to school online gives her the chance to train as much as she can while getting her education. "To be a champion I need to spend as much time as I can developing what will get me to the top of the podium, and that is wrestling. Venture Online helps me because I can choose what time works best for me and at what pace."

This summer, Jaydan traveled to the country of Georgia for two weeks to train with Valentin Kalika, an Olympic coach, Geno Petriashvili, World champion and Olympic bronze medalist, and Vladimir Khinchegashvili, an Olympic gold and silver medalist. "We had one dual while we were there, and I won the match." On October 9th, she'll be on her way to Japan to train and then compete.

"My dream and goal with wrestling are to become an Olympic champion. Ever since I was four years old, I'd consistently say I was going to be an Olympic champion one day, even though I didn't play or do any sports at that time. I'm looking forward to my future and my senior year with Venture Online."
